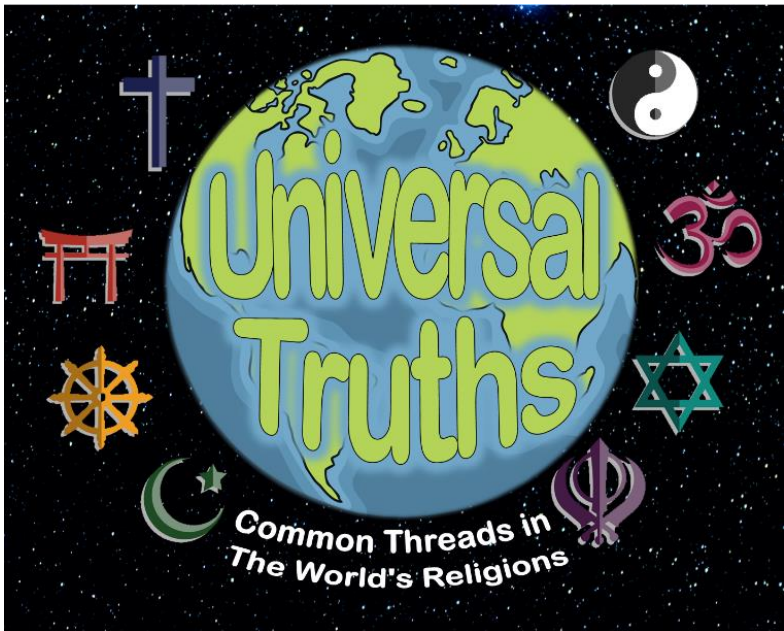

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 6:1-9

¹Now this is the commandment — the statutes and the ordinances — that the LORD your God charged me to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy, ²so that you and your children and your children's children may fear the LORD your God all the days of your life, and keep all his decrees and his commandments that I am commanding you, so that your days may be long. ³Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe them diligently, so that it may go well with you, and so that you may multiply greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, as the LORD, the God of your ancestors, has promised you. ⁴Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. ⁵You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. ⁶Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. ⁷Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. ⁸Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, ⁹and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

SECOND READING: GALATIANS 3:19-29

¹⁹Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the offspring would come to whom the promise had been made; and it was ordained through angels by a mediator. ²⁰Now a mediator involves more than one party; but God is one. ²¹Is the law then opposed to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could make alive, then righteousness would indeed come through the law. ²²But the scripture has imprisoned all things under the power of sin, so that what was promised through faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe. ²³Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. ²⁴Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, ²⁶for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. ²⁷As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

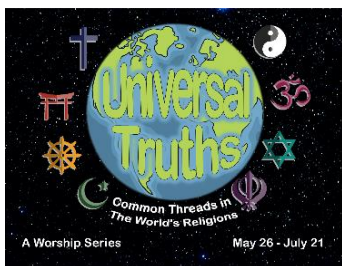
Fostering Hope is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that offers wrap around services to

LIVE GENEROUSLY

DID YOU KNOW that **thrivent**[®], a financial services organization, provides fraternal benefits to members that can financially directly impact the missions of Temple Lutheran Church as well as other nonprofit organizations?

Thrivent Action Teams: Each Thrivent benefit member is eligible to request up to \$250 twice a year to provide funding to a project in which they are organizing other volunteers to put on a fundraiser, educational event or service activity. Temple has benefited in the past by receiving funding to help with our Spaghetti Dinner, Mardi Gras and Yeti Cooler fundraisers and our Earth Day planting of flowers in the new park on Earlington Road.

Thrivent Choice[®] **Dollars:** Eligible clients with minimum products or investments with Thrivent are eligible to annually direct Thrivent Choice Dollars to the nonprofit (including churches) of their choice. Temple Lutheran has benefited by members who have directed some or all of their Thrivent Choice Dollars to our Unified fund. In 2023, Temple received close to \$2,000 through this program, which directly benefited our operating revenue.

Associate Membership: For an annual fee of \$19.95, people can become associate members, and are then eligible to request up to \$250 one time per year via the Thrivent Action Team program.
